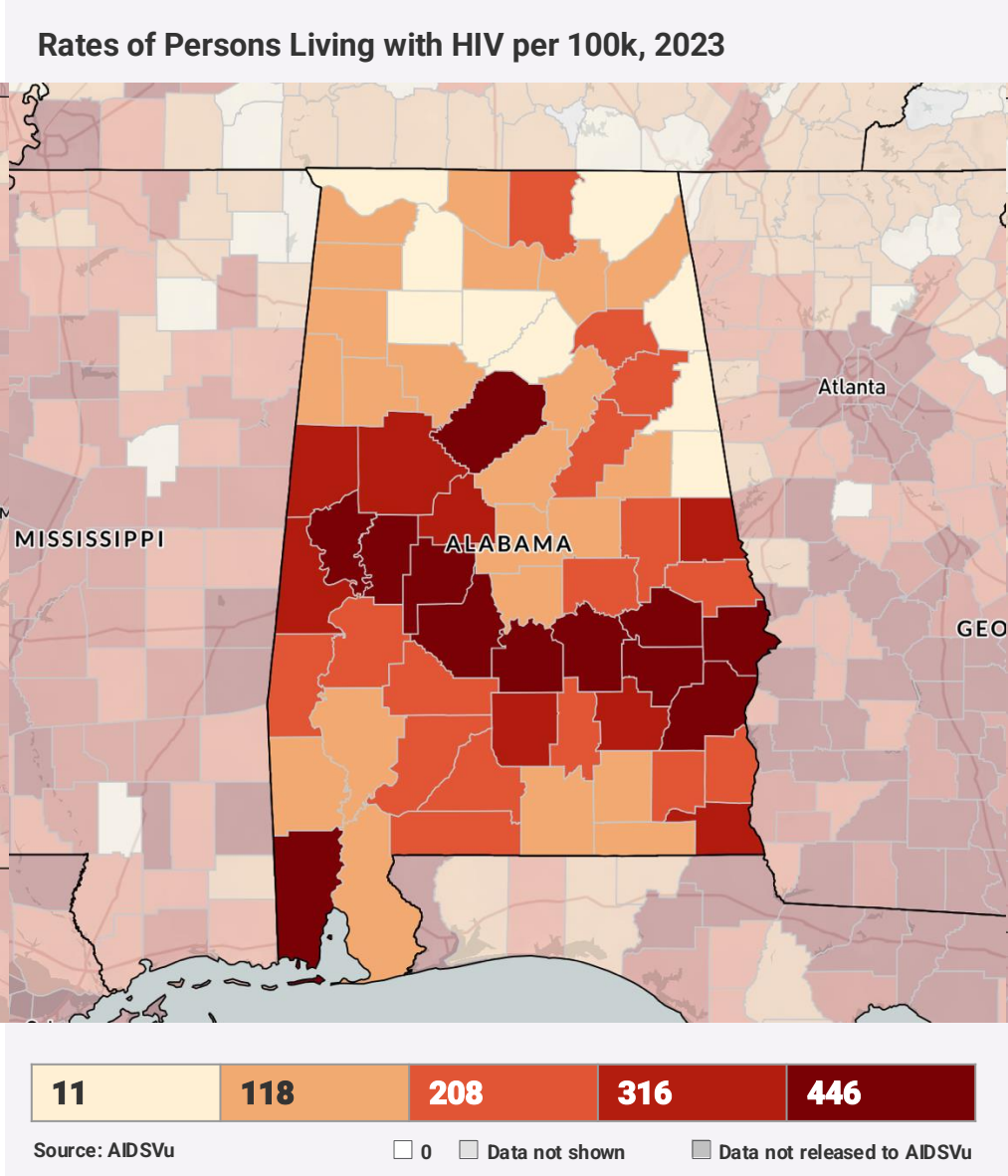
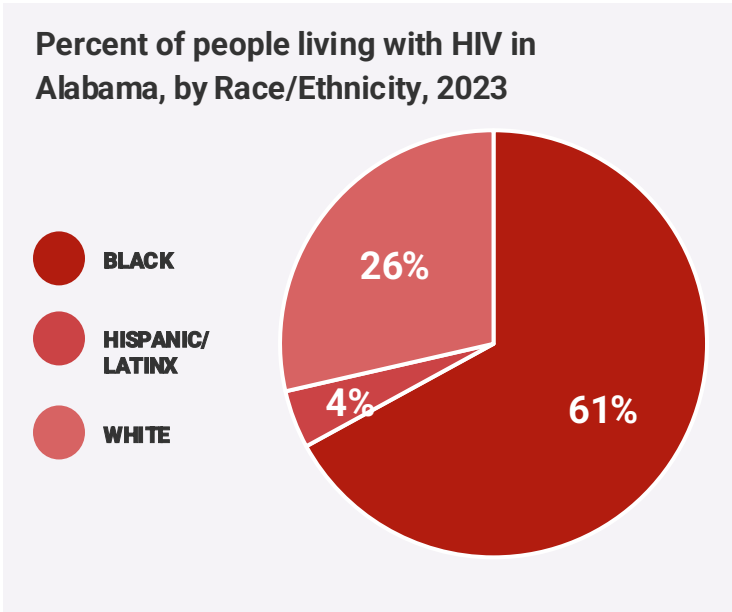
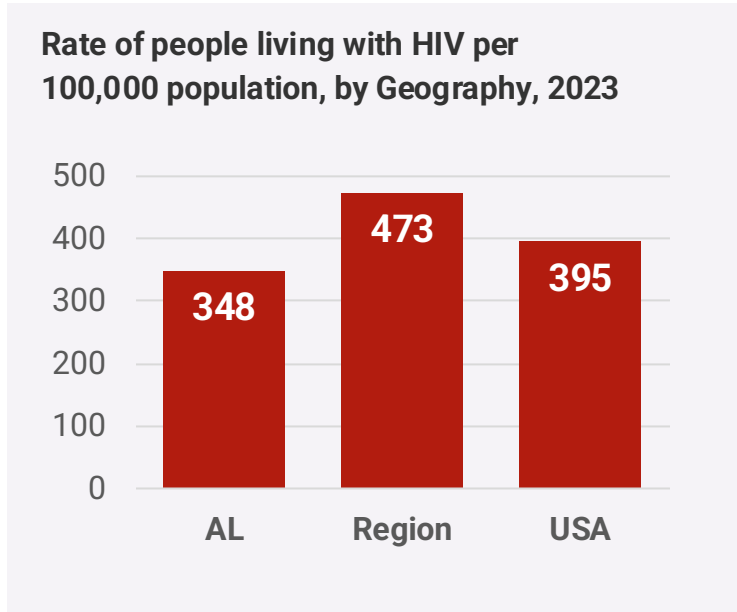


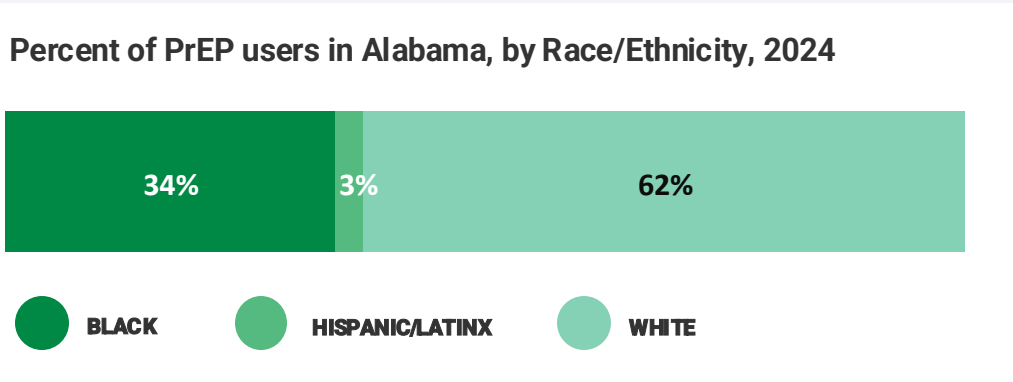
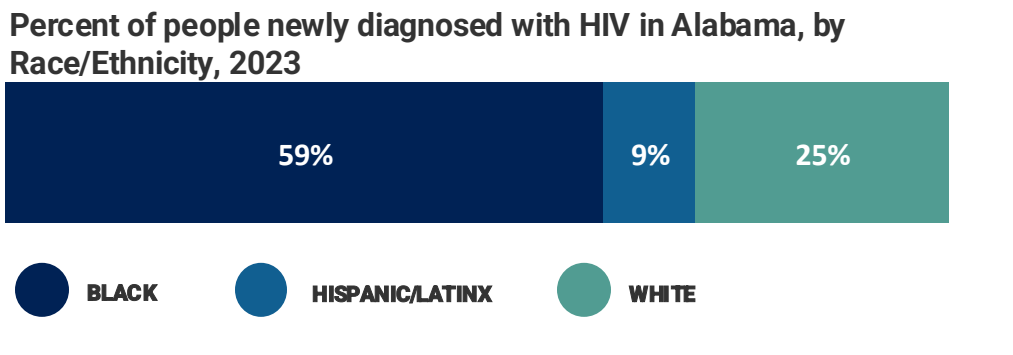
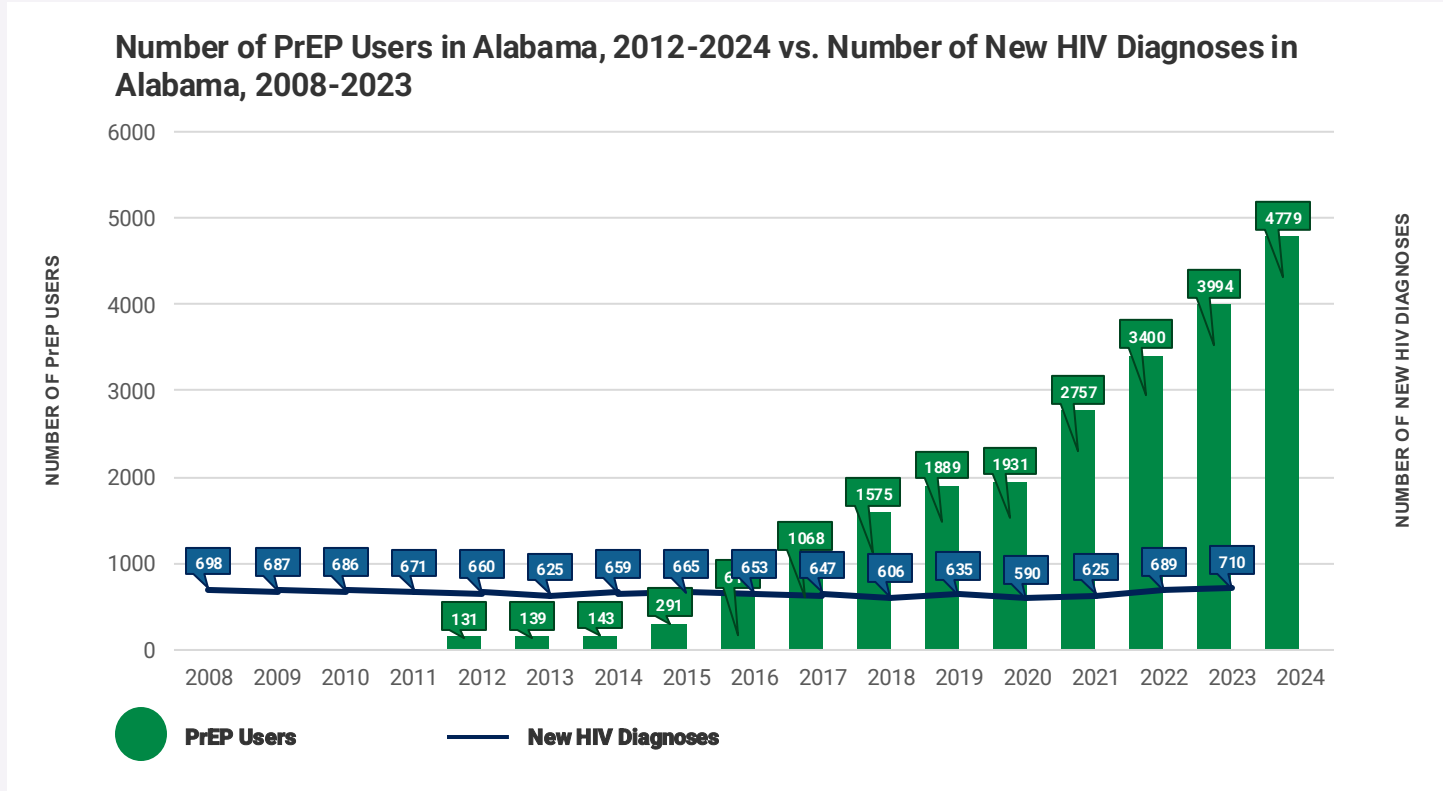
HIV IN ALABAMA

In 2023, there were **15,007** people living with HIV in Alabama. That same year, **710** people were newly diagnosed with HIV.



New HIV Diagnoses & PrEP Use

Pre-exposure prophylaxis, or **PrEP**, can protect people from acquiring HIV. We know that PrEP works in reducing new HIV diagnoses. Yet, PrEP use is not equitable. For example, **Black people represented nearly half (47%) of new HIV diagnoses in the South, yet were only 23% of PrEP users in the region.**



Viral HIV Suppression

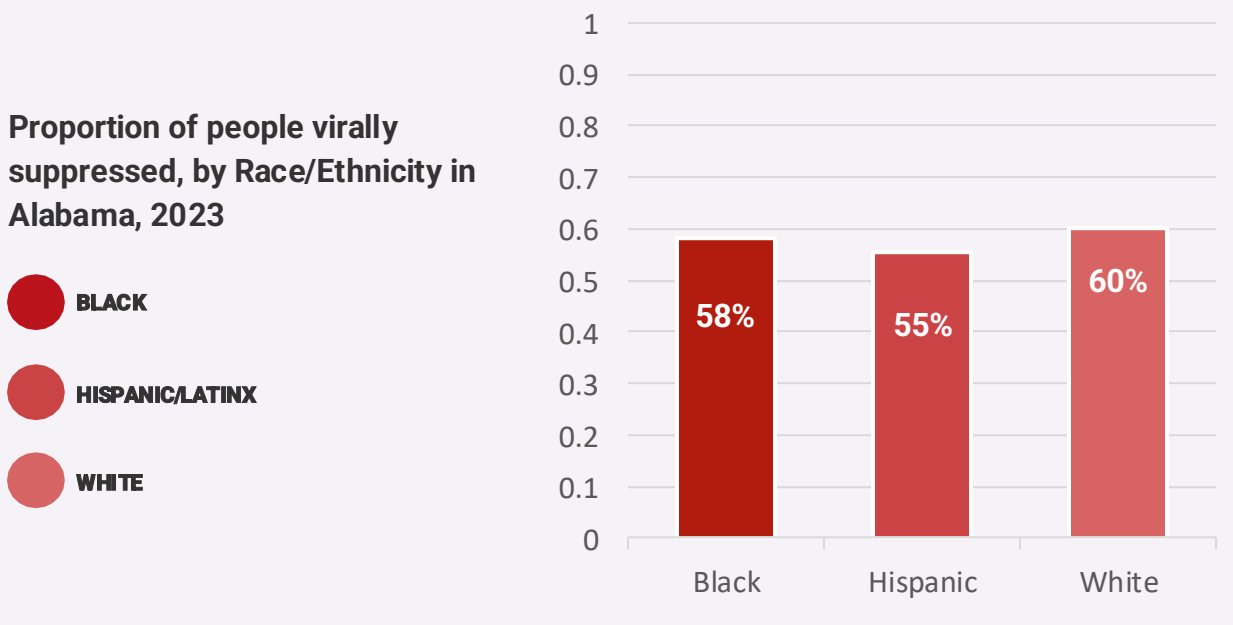
Viral suppression is defined as **those living with diagnosed HIV who had suppressed HIV viral load (<200 copies/mL).**

Number of people living with HIV who were virally suppressed in Alabama, 2023:

8,373

Percent of people living with HIV who were virally suppressed in Alabama, 2023:

59%



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
