

## HIV IN DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA


In 2021, there were **13,622 people living with HIV** in District of Columbia. That same year, **195 people were newly diagnosed with HIV**.







## **New HIV Diagnoses & PrEP Use**

Pre-exposure prophylaxis, or **PrEP, can protect people from acquiring HIV**. We know that PrEP works in reducing new HIV diagnoses. Yet, PrEP use is not equitable. For example, **Black people represented half (49%) of new HIV diagnoses in the South, yet were only 21% of PrEP users in the region**.







## **Viral HIV Suppression**

Viral suppression is defined as **those living with diagnosed HIV who had suppressed HIV viral load** (<200 copies/mL).

Number of people living with HIV who were virally suppressed in District of Columbia, 2021:


