

HIV IN LOUISIANA

In 2021, there were 21,552 people living with HIV in Louisiana. That same year, 899 people were newly diagnosed with HIV.



Rates of Persons Living with HIV per 100k, 2021




New HIV Diagnoses & PrEP Use


Pre-exposure prophylaxis, or **PrEP, can protect people from acquiring HIV**. We know that PrEP works in reducing new HIV diagnoses. Yet, PrEP use is not equitable. For example, Black people represented half (49%) of new HIV diagnoses in the South, yet were only 21% of PrEP users in the region.



Viral HIV Suppression

Viral suppression is defined as those living with diagnosed HIV who had suppressed HIV viral load (<200 copies/mL).


Number of people living with HIV who were virally suppressed in Louisiana, 2021:


Percent of people living with HIV who were virally suppressed in Louisiana, 2021:
