

## HIV IN MISSISSIPPI


In 2021, there were **9,873 people living with HIV** in Mississippi. That same year, **419 people were newly diagnosed with HIV**.






## **New HIV Diagnoses & PrEP Use**

Pre-exposure prophylaxis, or **PrEP**, **can protect people from acquiring HIV**. We know that PrEP works in reducing new HIV diagnoses. Yet, PrEP use is not equitable. For example, **Black people represented half (49%) of new HIV diagnoses in the South, yet were only 21% of PrEP users in the region**.





## **Viral HIV Suppression**


Viral suppression is defined as **those living with diagnosed HIV who had suppressed HIV viral load** (<200 copies/mL).


Number of people living with HIV who were virally suppressed in Mississippi, 2021:
