


HIV Crisis in the South

HIV impacts the South with greater intensity than the rest of the nation, accounting for over 50% of all new diagnoses despite only housing 38% of the U.S. population. This crisis demands immediate and focused action, especially in rural communities and among marginalized groups such as LGBTQ/trans people.

Our Rich Cultural Mosaic

The region is a mosaic of diverse cultures, each telling a unique story of life in the land of resilience and grace. Yet, beneath this cultural richness, significant public health challenges persist.



Urgent Challenges



HEALTH DISPARITIES

Disproportionate rates of HIV and other health issues among racial and ethnic minority populations are exacerbated in the South, demanding strategies that respect and protect underserved communities.



PERVASIVE STIGMA

Stigma around HIV and other conditions worsens the struggle for affected individuals. A 2021 survey by Gilead and GLADD found that in the South, stigma operates on multiple levels: the individual, media representation, and from a policy level. This is particularly acute for LGBTQ+ communities.



LIMITED HEALTHCARE ACCESS

Health care access in the South is largely dependent on a patchwork of programs that because of a combination of policy and funding decisions are woefully inadequate to meet the needs of the South. 7 of 10 states that have not expanded Medicaid reside in the South.



ECONOMIC INEQUALITY

Socio-economic disparities, legacies of Jim Crow, segregation, and ongoing structural racism continue to impact overall health and well-being, emphasizing the need for protecting the right to vote as a means to advocate for systemic change.

Bold Policy Proposals



EXPAND HEALTHCARE ACCESS & MEDICAID

Ensure everyone can access quality healthcare services by advocating for both the expansion of Medicaid to cover more low-income individuals and the improvement of overall healthcare access across the South.



IMPROVE HEALTH EQUITY

Implement targeted strategies to address and reduce health disparities among underserved populations, including those in rural communities.



COMBAT STIGMA

Enforce policies that address and reduce stigma and discrimination, incorporating harm reduction principles.



INCREASED FUNDING FOR PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAMS

Secure more funding for programs aimed at reducing HIV transmission and improving care.



HIV DECRIMINALIZATION/MODERNIZATION

Support efforts to decriminalize living with HIV and address over-policing and criminalization of communities of color.
